It has been proposed that all parents should attend a childcare training course in order to understand how to bring up their children. While I agree that parents need to learn about childcare, I think it is totally unrealistic to impose mandatory childcare training courses for all parent.

Obviously, it is crucial that parents know the basics of the childcare, particularly in the early months and years when they first have a child. Understanding a baby's

needs and the possible medical problems that can arise is essential for the baby's safety. Without such knowledges, parents could easily put their baby at risk or be unable to react appropriately in an emergency.

However although childcare is important, it would be impossible in practice to have obligatory childcare training courses for all parents due to the vast number of first-time parents each year. For example, statistics show that in most European countries hundreds of thousands of children are born annually, which means that twice as much people would have to attend a course each year. Both the massive scale and the huge cost of such a plan would make it very difficult to implement.

A much more practical solution than face-to-face teaching, therefore, would be to provide distance learning options via free online video training courses. This would ensure all parents have access to the necessary information at a fraction of the cost. Besides, it would also allow parents to decide which information meet their needs, and to rear their children according to their own culture.

In conclusion, rather than courses which have to be attending in person, it would be better to provide free online courses and educational websites. These would be relatively cheap to design and accessible to parents in their own free time.

Some people think that plastic shopping bags should be prohibited because they are one of the major pollutants of both land and water around the world. I agree entirely, but I also think other measures could be taken before imposing a totally ban.

The main reason plastic bags should be banned is because they are not biodegradable and therefore continue to pollute the environment for hundreds of years after being disposed of. Plastic bags are often used only once and end up polluting both soil and water, causing floods by clogging up drainage systems and

also causing the death of countless land and marine animals which get entangled in them or ingest them, and besides, even when plastic does start to break down, it fragments into microplastic particles which cause even more damage to animal life, so it seems that the only way to prevent throw-away plastic items from seriously and irreversibly damaging our planet would be to prohibit them.

However, it would be worth trying to change consumer behaviour before completely ban plastic bags. Plastic bags may be a convenience who shoppers appreciate, but they could very easily be replaced with reusable cloth bags. In addition, a plastic bag tax could be imposed in order to deter people from using so many single-use plastic bags. Altering consumer behaviour is an effective way of raising awareness of the plastic pollution as a whole, and this can lead to more action on other unnecessary plastic products in the future.

In conclusion, it is firmly believed that an eventual blanket ban on plastic bags are crucial to preserve life on this planet and protect it from the effects of throw-away non-biodegradable materials. Model Essay Answer Exercise

Many young people are leaving school without a basic understanding of how personal finances ought to be managed in the adult world. This shortcoming is due to a lack of life experience and limited education, and they can be overcome in two simple ways.

The main reason why so many school leavers are unable to handle their own finances are that they have been living with their parents for free. As a result, they have never had to earn a salary or save money in order to pay bills. Another cause is that personal financial planning is only rarely part of the school curriculum. Schools focus instead over classical subjects, such as maths, science and languages, which means important life skills are not being taught. Thus, both teachers and parents are failing to prepare young people for the real world.

There are two options for solving young peoples' inability to plan personal finances. Firstly parents should spend time with their children teaching them how money is earned, budgeted and used for either savings or expenses. One simple step could be for parents to start teaching young children how to manage their pocket money and, as their child grows up, expand into a more serious household expenses. Secondly, the schools should incorporate life skills into their final year curriculum. In this way, children will be able to learn in a supportive environment how their finances need to be budgeted and dealt with in order to avoid debt problems later in life.

In conclusion, young people lack of financial management skills due to the negligence of parents and schools, what can only be solved if both take more responsibility to equip school leavers with the right skills.

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
